

Shropshire Squash - End of Season Review Meeting 2019

Date: 9th May 2019

- 1. Apologies: Beth Grinsell (Wolverhampton LTSC).
- 2. Introduction DW initially introduced the meeting and ID added that these meetings were to be used to review the previous seasons competitions and leagues and give everyone a chance to have their input into any proposed rule changes or competition rule changes. ID was disappointed with the level of attendance this year.
- 3. Trophies Several trophies were awarded that had not been awarded at the main presentation.
- 4. Leagues
  - a. DW gave a brief overview of the seasons leagues
    - i. Div 1 9 Teams generally ran smoothly. Less issues this season with postponements / walk overs, only one we are aware of. C72 dropped out with only one game played which caused issues with many free weeks which the teams did not enjoy.
    - ii. Div 2 9 Teams generally ran smoothly. Only 2 w/o.
    - iii. Div 3 10 Teams again ran reasonably well. LFD dropped out before the first game, this again caused issues with free weeks.
    - iv. Squash 57-7 Teams Generally ran smoothly again.
  - b. League Entries How can we stop drop outs?
    - i. The general consensus was to ask for league entry fees when the team is entered, thus getting a firm commitment from the club. Refunds would only be possible with agreement from the committee in extenuating circumstances.
  - c. Where would returning teams be placed?
    - i. The discussion focused on where teams had pulled out of the leagues because they couldn't field a team and then decide to enter again the following season should they be allowed to be placed in the same league that they withdrew from? It was felt that any returning team should be placed in the league below where they were previously placed.
  - d. Rule 17 Walk overs How can these be dealt with?
    - i. The discussion concluded that a strict penalty needed to be applied to the defaulting team whilst giving the non-defaulting team a reasonable score, the





- proposal was minus 10 points to defaulting team, with 14 points to non-defaulting team.
- ii. Notice needs to be given to the league secretary prior to any postponement and an agreement gained.
- e. Rule 15.1 & 15.2 Team Nominations The discussion was around how teams should seed / nominate their players especially where the clubs had multiple teams in the same league?
  - i. The outcome was that we should go back to having team seedings confirmed at the beginning of the season and then have a re-seeding window during the Xmas break
  - ii. Seed all players nominated for a team. SportyHQ allows any number of seeded players
  - iii. Clubs could be asked to provide a full list of club seedings?
- f. Rule 18.1 Order of Merit How could we ensure teams provide their playing order in accordance with the rules?
  - i. Conclusion was to apply a penalty of minus 5 points to any team not providing the team playing order on SportyHQ by the start of play of the fixture.
- g. Rule 11.1 Cup tied rule Did this new rule work?
  - i. The conclusion was that it was felt this did not work and penalised smaller clubs, so the conclusion was to remove this rule?
- h. Rule 9.1 Eligibility How can we ensure a more equal way for this rule to work that provides a solution to allow it to happen but not penalise the smaller clubs?
  - i. The conclusion was to amend the rule so that where there are multiple teams in a league from the same club any player playing 'up' for the other team can only do so twice before being tied to the higher team. Where a player plays up a division the current rule 9.1 applies.
  - ii. Seeded players cannot play for another team in the same division?

## 5. County Competitions -

- a. Overall all competitions were run over the season with a few issues. Thank you to lan Tanner for organising and Shropshire SRC for hosting the junior closed. Alex Whitehouse for organising and Shrewsbury SRC for hosting the county closed. Don Wallington for organising and Shropshire SRC for hosting the Knock Out Cup Finals and Trophy presentation.
- b. Team knock out cup
  - i. The format of all finals being played on the same night continued to work well and all agreed to keep this format.
  - ii. A proposal was put forward to possibly running the competition in a block rather than over the season, either in the middle or at the end of the season.
- c. Junior County Closed
  - i. Hosting Worked well this season and well organised with reasonable entries. It is proposed to move the date to the spring to coincided with the school's squash term to boost entries. It should be noted that the entrants still need to meet the entry criteria, but additional entries would be welcome.
- d. Senior County Closed -





- i. Worked well this season due to the organiser chasing entries etc. The current format of play by date seems to work well, we need to ensure the competition starts earlier next season, so it doesn't clash with the club competitions etc at the end of the season.
- e. Shropshire Copper / Bronze Events
  - i. Great to see these events being held in the county. Only one club at present but keen to get more clubs involved. Need to ensure committee involvement so that we can support event and help promote etc.

## 6. Inter County Teams -

- a. ID thanked the captains of last season's teams for the time and effort in organising the teams. ID asked the current captains to consider which age categories should be entered next season and if they would consider continuing as captain. ID advised that entries generally needed to be submitted by the end of July. ID advised that he would request confirmation when ES had issued the official entry information as last season it was far later.
- b. Overall a good season and great to see the O65 team in the finals weekend.
- c. Juniors U15 & U19 Junior County Teams successfully run by G Rutter (U15), Dan Aimer (U19), hope to run again next season. Chairman noted that the county does not have a county junior development officer / coach and would like to appoint one. ID noted that he needs to re-engage with Shropshire Squash Club to see if the new professional coach (Miles Jenkins) can assist the county junior set up.

## 7. ES Update -

- a. ID provided discussed ES affiliation again. The three routes that can be adopted by each county are outlined below.
  - Option 1 Continue with existing system where ES affiliation of clubs and players is not mandatory. No increase in rebate to county.
  - Option 2 Agree to make ES Affiliation mandatory for all clubs and players. This will double the rebate received from ES to the county.
  - Option 3 Apply and county levy to the fees from option 2 which would be paid back to the county from England Squash as part of the rebate payment, this is a function that allows counties to receive payments from the clubs to put towards development projects etc.
- b. The chairman discussed the merits of each option and suggested that option 2 should be considered as we ask for this anyway for all clubs and players in our leagues. At last years AGM it was decided to review again at the end of the season. Another vote will be taken at the AGM. ID asked that all clubs review this option over the summer break.
- 8. AOB Ian confirm that no official requests had been received prior to the meeting and opened it up to the floor.
  - a. The Chairman advised that there was a development work shop being held in early June at Shrewsbury SRC and encouraged everyone to attend.





There being no further business lan / Don thanked everyone for their attendance and support and closed the meeting.
